



Literature Displays

Display Objectives:

Designed to show key elements of the Quad-Lock building system, these displays are also designed to hold literature (brochures, flyers, DVDs, etc) in a compact, streamlined format. These displays are ideal for showrooms or trade shows.

Basic Format:

Each Quad-Lock display is 12" wide by 12" deep by 4' high using Quad-Lock Regular or Plus Panels and 6" Ties and are mounted on a 16" x 16" x 5" base. Clear, acrylic magazine and brochure racks are attached to the displays as required.





Materials Required:

- Sheet ½" finish grade plywood
- "Lazy Susan" turn-table bracket (for rotating displays)
- Qty. 6 Wood screws
- Gray paint and/or polyurethane
- 4' of 2¼" Quad-Lock Metal Track
- Qty. 2 QPX2 Regular Panels
- (6) 6" Full Ties-Blue
- 6" Wire Top Ties
- Magazine display – for flyers and brochures*
- (1-2) Narrow Brochure Holders – for tri-fold flyers, i.e. Installation Guides*
- Wide Brochure Holder – for DVDs*
- 8½" x 11" Upright Sign – for top of display*
- Waterproofing material (optional)
- Sheet Rock and Edge Protector (optional)

Tools Needed:

- Metal Shears/Snips
- Pruning Shears
- Drill
- Sliding Miter Saw (preferred for clean cuts)

Instructions:

1. Start by cutting the appropriate pieces of wood to construct a 5-sided box that is 16" square and 5" high. In addition, cut out a circular piece of plywood 18" in diameter. Assemble the box and mark the center. This will be the reference point for placing the turn table bracket if you choose to build a spinning display. Once the wood pieces are painted or stained, assemble accordingly.
2. Cut four 12" pieces of 2¼" Metal Track. It is suggested that the edges be bevel cut about 30° to keep sharp points away from the public (see photos). Take two pieces of track and center them on the turn table and secure each piece of track with three short wood screws.
3. Take two QPX2 Panels and cut four 12" pieces. A sliding miter saw will provide the cleanest cut so that there will be no factory edges exposed. Once cut, place the first course. Continue building each successive course, placing 6 ties so that they hang out each side. This will provide a good visual for customers when you're explaining how the Quad-Lock Ties span both vertical as well as horizontal joints, compared to the competition.
4. Once the fourth and last course is placed, add a 6" Wire Top Tie at each end of the top row and cap with Metal Track. The display is complete.

Tips & Recommendations:

- Paint or stain wood base pieces before assembly. This is easier and makes for a cleaner finished product and is ultimately easier.
- Sheet rock on one side is definitely recommended to hang literature/DVD holders. When the sheet rock is screwed on, place screws so that they span horizontal connections. This will allow the display to be picked up from the top without falling apart.
- A water-proofing solution and/or stucco solution lends itself well to the display; it provides the chance to get the customer committed to using accessories right in the showroom.
- The rounded turn-table top is highly recommended as it allows the customer to see the whole display and takes up less space either in the showroom or in a trade show booth. The rounded edges cut down on a tripping hazard the wider base creates.
